Fituese winning as she liked at Warwick Farm!!!
Cost \$50,000 2018 Perth Magic Millions

I have been thrilled with our results over the past 12 days. **Rubisaki** was awesome on Saturday and a credit to her trainer Patrick Payne. She is a very promising filly with 3 wins and two 2nd placings from just 5 starts. She is on track to head to the \$1 million Inglis Sprint for 3yo's on 8 February at Warwick Farm. Thank you to Jye McNeil for an excellent ride. She was an \$85,000, 2018 Inglis Classic Sale graduate.

Fituese was as impressive at Warwick Farm on Wednesday disposing of her opposition as if she was in a different class. There was Libertini form in this race so her effort shouldn't be underestimated. She now heads to Canterbury on 13 December stepping out to 1100m. She is a Magic Millions filly although it would be a big ask to get her to the Gold Coast on 11 January, but stranger things have happened. She has now won two of her three starts. Well done to John Thompson and his staff. She was a \$50,000, 2018 Perth Magic Millions graduate.

Illecebrous was terrific at Scone winning by panels in only her second start. Kris Lees has done a great job with her. She is by Champion sire More Than Ready and would be a very valuable brood mare if she won or was placed in the right race. She has it all ahead of her. She was a \$90,000, 2018 Inglis Classic Sale graduate.

Kogi Lass was very unlucky at Kyneton. She didn't get the best ride but to her credit kept coming in the straight for a game 3rd placing. She may well head to Echuca on 12 December where she should be well placed. She was a \$120,000, 2018 Gold Coast Magic Millions graduate.

Zizzis was very good running a strong 2nd at Moonee Valley on Saturday. She is being aimed at the Magic Millions Carnival and appears to have come back as good as ever. The 2018 Adelaide Magic Millions winner was a \$120,000, 2017 Gold Coast Magic Millions graduate.

Our only disappointing runner was **Golden Script** who didn't finish her race off as expected. Hopefully Patrick Payne can get the mare, previously trained by Darren Weir back to her best. Patrick has had to contend with a number of issues since taking over the mare's training.

This Saturday sees the highly promising mare **Almerheri** resuming at Rosehill. She is also Magic Millions bound. The winner of three Sydney Metropolitan races over the past 12 months she is an exciting prospect. John Thompson has done a great job with the \$50,000, 2017 Adelaide Magic Millions graduate.

Invincible Al is an explosive sprinter on his day and is set to have his first start for Tony Gollan on Saturday at Doomben in the Listed Bribie Handicap. He was previously trained by Patrick Payne who

did a great job with him. Patrick was right behind the decision to move him to Brisbane where the style of racing and drop in standard should see him win some more races for his owners. He is an outside chance to get to the Magic Millions Sprint on 11 January. He would need to win the BRC Falvelon Stakes on 21 December to make the field. This would see him gain a 'wild card' entry to the race. Invincible Al was a \$50,000, private purchase from Yarraman Park Stud.

The 2018 Tasmanian Magic Millions winner, **Our Long Sali** is progressing along and will resume on 18 December in Launceston. She will be aimed at several 'Black Type' races during the Tasmanian Summer Carnival. She was a \$32,500, 2017 Tasmanian Magic Millions graduate.

I have highlighted where we sourced each of these horses from. I travel across the country to put our team of yearlings together and have capped the number at 15 each year. There are some very good horses listed above with a majority being purchased for less than \$100,000. I like to think we are the best value syndication company in Australia.

Over the past few months we have retired **Casa De Lago**, **Hussy's Glow** and **Reneged** from our team. Each of these stakes placed horses were good winners for us. It is amazing how we seem to have more than replaced them with some outstanding young gallopers. The future looks very bright indeed.

I am heading to Sydney for the races on Saturday and then on to the Hunter Valley where I will be inspecting yearlings at about 20 studs. I plan to purchase four to six yearlings at the Gold Coast. I'm confident the prices will be realistic. I'm hoping to secure two yearlings each for John, Kris and Patrick. My plan is to purchase two yearlings for Adam Trinder. These are most likely to come out of the Tasmanian Magic Millions or Inglis Premier Sales.
